

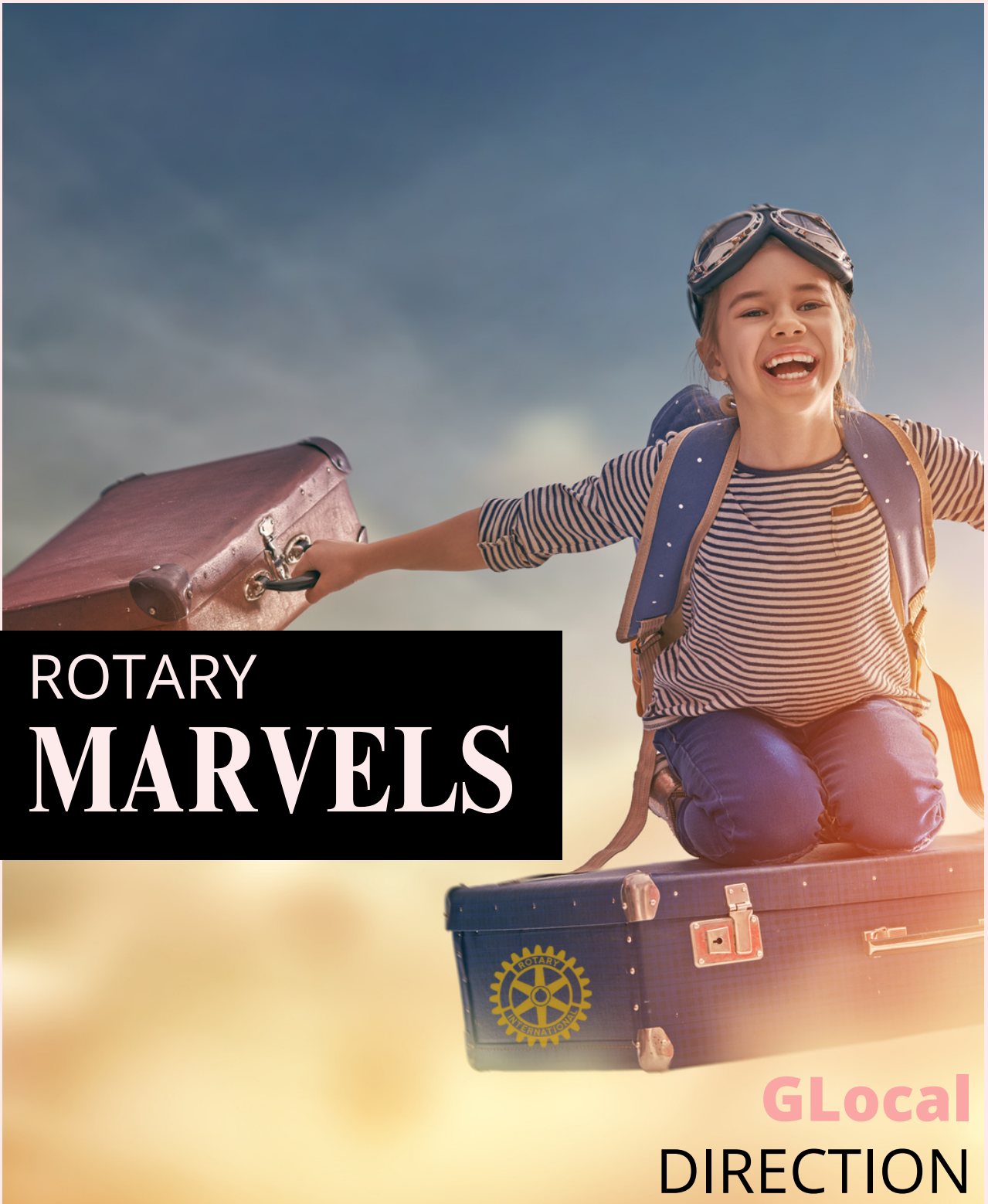

This year has marked a significant advancement in the Path of Hope Foundation's mission to break the intergenerational cycle of family violence, achieved through our strategic collaboration with The Salvation Army, supported by Rotary.

The Foundations contributions directly to The Salvation Army in Western Australia through fund raising, have supported their great work in continuing to deliver essential services with notable outcomes. To mention a few, these include; providing 437 counselling sessions to women and children, and accommodating 180 women and children in their refuges/wellness centres in Perth and Karratha.

The continued partnership between Rotary and The Salvation Army is a testament to our joint commitment to making a meaningful impact in the lives of those affected by family violence.

Path of Hope flourishes thanks to the collaborative spirit, mentorship attitudes and the combined dedication of our volunteers, sponsors and donors. PATH OF HOPE FOUNDATION

In 2012, Path of Hope Foundation was founded by Perth Rotary to raise awareness about family violence to support The Salvation Army's Work with women and children. Path of Hope Foundation is a project, with an approach which mobilises the organisational capacity of Rotarians. The Salvation Army's services provide safety, support and programs to women and children rebuilding their lives after Family Violence ("FV").

Path of Hope Foundation leverages the organisational capacity of Rotarians to support The Salvation Army's agencies and services, focusing on ensuring the safety and empowerment of women and children who are victims/survivors of family violence. This approach signifies a deep commitment to addressing a critical social issue through collaboration and community support.

Since its inception, the Path of Hope Foundation operates as a Public Ancillary Fund (PuAF) with an approved fundraising license in Western Australia. The scope of the foundation's work has grown significantly, marking it as an upcoming international operational project supported by Rotary International. This expansion reflects the foundation's growing influence and capacity to make a meaningful difference in the lives of those affected by family violence.

Through these efforts, the Path of Hope Foundation embodies a spirit of service, fellowship, and leadership, aligned with the core values of Rotary International. The foundation plays a vital role in aiding Rotarians supporting their local Salvation Army breaking the intergenerational cycle of family violence.

INTERNSHIP

The 'HOPE Internship - Mentoring program' at Path of Hope, spanning 100 hours over a semester or a four-week intensive session, offers students a comprehensive learning experience, replacing a university unit. They participate in various operational areas, applying their academic knowledge in real-world scenarios. From 2017 to 2023, we've had a diverse group of interns starting with our local project.

From Curtin we have had a total of nineteen interns who have contributed to areas like marketing and events. The program not only enhances the interns professional skills but also fosters personal growth and a spirit of community service. Our mentoring program connects the student interns with experienced professionals, enriching their learning experience. We aim to prepare our interns for success in a 'GLocally' connected world, equipping them with the skills to navigate global and local settings effectively.

Path of Hope is committed to nurturing future leaders, empowering them with the skills and experiences necessary to thrive in their chosen fields in today's interconnected world.

THE HOPE REPORT

Purpose and Contribution

The interns role was pivotal in advancing the understanding of Family Violence (FV) through legal research and the study of its intergenerational effects. They contributed significantly to 'The Hope Report', providing insights into the effectiveness of legal frameworks addressing FV. The interns also engaged in international relations research, areas of policy development and diplomatic efforts.

Key Responsibilities

1. Analysed FV dynamics, global legislation, and societal impacts.
2. Investigated international conflicts, diplomatic relations, and organisational structures.
3. Supported policy analysis in FV and international arenas.
4. Facilitated support for international events and diplomatic engagements.
5. Enhanced skills in intercultural communication and professional report writing.
6. Enhanced skills in intercultural communication and professional report writing.
7. Collaborated with global partners including Rotarians, NGOs, and professionals.
8. Participated in FV prevention and international development initiative, such as 'The HOPE Report'.
9. Advocated for societal change following Rotary's ethical guidelines.
10. Integrated feedback to refine research and professional skills.

Engagement and Development

Interns collaborated with international educational and professional partners, focusing on integrating theoretical knowledge with practical experiences in the fields of Family Violence (FV) and International Relations. Throughout the academic year, four groups of interns participated in the program. During Semester 1 and 2, interns were engaged one day per week, while the Winter and Summer intensive internships required a commitment of three days per week.

Outcome

Our 'HOPE Internship - Mentoring Program', through initiatives such as "The Hope Report," seeks to foster a lifelong commitment to community service and legal excellence among our interns. This project examines strategic efforts to combat intergenerational family violence and provides practical experience and policy engagement opportunities, international relationships and collaborations, preparing the interns for impactful careers.

⁰¹ 2022/23 Financial Support

In the 2022/23 financial year, The Salvation Army's WA Family and Family Violence services were significantly supported by \$165,638.40 raised by the Rotary Club of Perth's Path of Hope project. This funding enabled the expansion of outreach and counseling services, including hiring 1.5 Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Community Outreach Case Managers to improve response to domestic violence and enhance support and coordination. Additionally, it supported a 0.4 FTE Part-Time Adult Family Violence Counsellor and a 0.2 FTE Part-Time Child Family Violence Counsellor, focusing on providing specialized trauma recovery and resilience support to clients in various accommodations and outreach settings. These roles were instrumental in aiding victims in healing from trauma and providing trauma-informed care to children.

⁰² Achievements and Impact

The year's outcomes included supporting 61 clients in outreach, providing 437 counseling sessions, accommodating 180 women and children in crisis services, assisting 16 clients with visa rights, and developing a primary prevention program. These efforts highlight the service's commitment to addressing FDV through comprehensive support, collaboration, and community engagement.

⁰³ Strategic Future Goals

The future plans for Western Australian Family Violence services include aligning their agenda with the national one for consistent quality improvement, forming partnerships with diverse groups including Aboriginal, LGBTQIA+, CALD, and disability organizations. They aim to enhance early intervention and prevention education, improve client exit options by increasing long-term housing availability, and promote social equality through intersectional work. Additionally, they plan to expand crisis accommodation services and repurpose the unused recreational kitchen at Graceville for better service delivery.
